I still believe in the Lord's personal return as predicted in Scripture. I am not as dogmatic about some of the details as I was in 1972 when I was starting my ministry journey. The Late Great Planet Earth probably gave me all the answers at that time. Somehow the Lord never read the book and missed His appearance!

There are, however, several attitudes listed in Matthew 24 that still serve me well while I wait:

- The attitude of *humility* (vv 36, 42). I am okay with "no one knows the day ٠ or hour." He is God, I am not. He will come back.
- The attitude of *alertness* (vv 37-41). Just because we do not know when does not mean we should get lazy and stop being alert, staying on the watch. He will come.
- The attitude of *readiness* (vv 43-44). No matter how long we wait, there must be a renewed, constant sense of being ready in life and heart. "So you also must be ready..." (v 44a). He will return.
- The attitude of *faithfulness* (vv 45-51). We are to be found "doing (serving • Christ) so when He returns." Stay by the stuff of God's work while we are waiting. Jesus is coming. You can count on it!

The Lord leaves His people on earth to stay active until He returns. I have always lived by the philosophy that when the Lord is finished with me, He will let me know.
