At the age of 66, Pastor Tim Keller recently announced that on July 1 of this year he will be retiring from his preaching and leadership responsibilities at Christ Redeemer Church in New York City. And though Christ Redeemer has grown to be a megachurch of 5,000 under Keller's pastoral leadership, seeking to maintain those numbers under one "church banner" is not the vision of the leadership at Christ Redeemer.

The transition that is soon to take place follows a vision plan Redeemer set in place back in 1997, to raise up pastors and leadership who would create sustainable churches which would not require someone like Tim Keller — someone who had his degree of gifts, intelligence, etc. — to carry on the ministry. "This is not primarily a succession plan," Kathy Keller said. "It is a vision for not being a megachurch."

If you have an opinion on how large a church can or should be, you are not alone. But if you are more concerned with being effective as a church in reaching your community, your particular culture with the gospel, then you are concerned about the right thing.

Tim Keller has said, "The gospel is a living force, always sending and giving — and as I am sent in a new way now, so is every member of Redeemer, to love and serve this great city."

If the gospel is a "living force, always sending and giving," then

shouldn't each of us be open to being sent in a way determined by God's Spirit? I wonder if many of the problems we encounter personally and our churches encounter collectively are because we focus far more on receiving what the gospel has for us, rather than delivering to others what the gospel has for them. We are eager to receive but are slow to go — to be sent — in order that the gospel might continue to impact those around us. Maybe what we are missing is the vision to see our part in the sustaining work of the gospel.

How open are you to being redirected to a "new ministry," to a "new opportunity" where you can continue to make an impact for Christ and deliver the gospel news about Jesus to those who have yet to hear or who have yet to respond?
