Marionette Christianity

A marionette is a puppet controlled by strings or wires. The movement of the marionette is controlled, limited, directed by the one who is dictating the movements.

Perhaps you've been given something by someone (a responsibility, opportunity, or financial gift) and you've felt like a marionette. You can't see the strings, but you've felt them: expectations that you must now do things in a particular way or that you now owe something in return.

Now there's nothing wrong with expectations as long as they are reasonable, clear and understood. God grants us the gift of salvation through His Son, but also expects certain things from us—that we will continue to choose Him and love Him and seek to make His Kingdom priorities our own. That's completely reasonable.

He won't "make" us do the good He desires us to do. He won't make us live out the Kingdom realities we have been granted through our relationship with Jesus. That is our responsibility—to choose to walk in step with His Spirit—making choices that line up with the grace we have already received in Christ and continue to receive.

My question is this: what if you feel you have spiritual "strings" attached to your walk with God? Strings that limit your freedom to be who God has called you to be, maybe because of the presence of sin in your

life, or maybe because of a legalistic spirit that others have placed on youthat you have to do something in a way that they think you should do it. What do you do?

In Galatians 5:1, the apostle Paul says "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let vourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." The freedom for which Christ set us free isn't about doing what we want, when we want, how we want. It's about the freedom to worship Him. serve Him. rest in Him and enjoy Him.

When Paul says that we are to "stand firm," he's calling us to be rooted and established in the freedom Christ secured for us through His death and resurrection. We have been re-created in Christ with a freedom to serve Him and His purposes. He has called us and set us apart from the world of sin and from the world of religiosity that limits our ability to be who Christ has called and gifted us to be.

The world doesn't need more marionettes, it needs uniquely fashioned and gifted followers of Jesus who express the heart and character of the One who has set them free. Cut the strings of religiosity and sin and be who Christ has uniquely created and gifted you to be.

The Church of Jesus Christ needs you to be who Christ has created you to be. And so does this world. Cut the strings. Be free.
