WHAT I'M LEARNING...

Last week a package arrived on my doorstep: it was a print of a Rembrandt painting I've had my eye on for a while. It's called *Christ in the Storm on the Sea of Galilee*, and it portrays the moment when the panicking disciples wake Jesus up from the nap he was taking on board their boat during a terrifying storm.

In Luke 8:25, after calming the storm, Jesus asks the disciples, "Where is your faith?" What looked like a deadly storm became the environment for these disciples to continue learning more about Jesus and to grow in their nascent faith in Him.

As we head into the fall, in our churches we're spending a lot of time planning programs, organizing outreaches, building budgets, and managing memberships. But we must ask ourselves the question: **Are we making disciples?** And we should also ask ourselves: **Am <u>I</u> growing as a disciple of Jesus?**

In Matthew 28:19, Jesus commissions us to make disciples. Disciples are learners. We are to be growing in our faith and obedience and love for Jesus, following His example in how we treat one another and others. We are to help each other grow; and we are to ever be growing and learning ourselves. As we move into a new ministry season this fall, is **your** church making disciples? Where does this best happen? In a 90-minute Sunday morning service? What are the environmental conditions in which disciples grow? I'm learning that growth is not dependent on having the right program or the best sermon, but rather dependent on having a humble, learning attitude, in the day-to-day of life, **with other disciples**. Disciple-making is more about having the right environment and attitude, not about having the polished program or crafted words. Discipleship even happens in the midst of the darkest storm.

Whether it's during a storm, or at the table eating together, or cleaning up your community's downtown area together, discipleship can be happening. Are you making disciples? Are you a growing disciple of Jesus Christ?
