Thoughts from the district guy...



erhaps the best book I've read since the start of the pandemic is Mark Sayers' A Non-Anxious Presence. Savers describes how we're currently living in a gray zone moment: the world has changed, and we do not yet know completely how, or what, the world is changing into.

In grav zone moments, we seek out comfort and security in "strongholds" that have brought us identity and "safety" in the past. However, they fall short in the new context in which we find ourselves. And the result is anxiety. Sayers writes. "Most understand that the world has changed. However. the sheer rate of change has left many disoriented. We, too. have been left with a sense of the potent chaos in the world.

We are not as in control as we thought. We are left with questions of how to lead at such a time when the rules seem to have changed" (p.20).

Savers spends time looking back at how we've arrived here and describing the current landscape. And then, he highlights how this is a time of opportunity. We don't grow when we're comfortable. It's in the "wilderness" where God grows leaders for the Church. "Leaders move people toward growth. Comfort zones insulate us from development" (p.109).

God is at work during the anxiety-filled gray zone moments! He is growing leaders who will lead with a non-anxious presence in the midst of change and seeming chaos. These leaders are able to lead with a non-anxious presence because they encounter and are refreshed by the presence of God (p.145).

Our churches and our people—and I would add our society—need us to be leaders who live daily in the presence of God. Our identity, our strength, our wisdom come from Him. As the psalmist declares. "He is my loving ally and my fortress, my tower of safety, my rescuer. He is my shield, and I take refuge in him..." (Psalm 144:2). Keeping our eyes on Jesus in the midst of the storm is the best thing we can do for the people whom we lead and serve.

"In an anxious, crisis-driven environment, the leadership leverage comes from a non-anxious person" (p.100). We become non-anxious persons by living and leading in the presence of God.

Helen in Bolivia

In May of 2011—following a year of Spanish studies—larrived in Bolivia to help EFCCM Missionary Heather MacKnee in her work with El Candelero Kids. Through the Government Department for children in Tarija, Heather started a drop-in Support Centre offering before or after school care where we help children with their homework. They also read, memorize and write out Bible verses, sing, and play games. Everyone sits down for a good meal and helps clean up afterward. Heather has a staff of five nationals to help.

In 2013, a friend gave Heather 5004 square metres of land, and construction started on a Home for Boys. In 2014 the boys, along with dorm parents and family, moved into the Home! Our boys are abandoned children, not orphans.

This past year we have completed many renovations to meet new government regulations and to receive accreditation by the new Bolivian government who oppose our work with Bolivian children because we are evangelicals.

I have land and a small house and garage close to the Boys' Home and work with the Boys when not at the Support Centre or teaching English in the city. The boys help me with yard work and get paid well. My contact with them is positive as I live out my life before them and the dorm parents. I help them with English, help maintain the buildings and vehicles, and get the land ready for corn and vegetables. At present, I can only stay in Bolivia six months per year. I live in my garage and am praying for a couple to live in my house to help with the work of El Candelero Kids.

Turning Point Youth Centre

Things are going well at Turning Point Youth Centre! We have been open for 3.5 years now and have 3 full-time staff.

The Centre was started by the EFC in Meadow Lake after seeing a huge gap in services in the community. God led us to fill the need with a youth drop-in centre. Currently, there are 10 to 25 youth who attend each day the Centre is open, and we run many amazing programs, including Bible Study twice a week, life skills classes, and many fun events.

Our mission is to be a safe and fun place where youth can hear the gospel. Praise God, we have seen many put their faith in Jesus since we opened our doors! We also connect each young person with a Christian mentor after they make the decision to follow Jesus!

As important as the sessions are, it is equally important for us to hang out, network, eat and laugh together.

I speak for many that this conference is not only a highlight each year, but also one of the most significant times of rest and growth in our ministry lives.

Many of our youth pastors and youth workers across the Prairie District have attended *oxygen*! This conference is open to any youth pastor or leader overseeing a youth-related ministry.
