WHAT I'M LEARNING...

Unexpectedly, Christmas this year has become a juxtaposition for me. As my wife and I look forward to some of our children coming home for Christmas, as we look forward to our first experience of having a daughter bring her fiancé home for Christmas, as we decorate our home and plan to attend local Christmas events, we received news that my stepfather died this past Friday.

So now the joy and expectancy of the Christmas season has been juxtaposed next to my mother's grief and the process of walking with her through the handling of the estate. A week that was planned to feature some slowing down has now become a week of travel to BC with numerous appointments. The celebration of the birth of Christ is juxtaposed to the death of my mother's husband of 28 years.

But is this really an unexpected juxtaposition? At Christmas—and throughout the rest of the year—our culture prefers to leave Jesus in the manger. But the testimony of Scripture, even the accounts of Jesus' birth, always look forward to the purpose of His coming. The good news of great joy is that a Savior has been born. His name will be Jesus because He will save His people from their sins. Old man Simeon revealed to Mary that Jesus would be opposed by many. The birth of Jesus always anticipates His redeeming death for us.

Hebrews 2 explains the gracious and loving purposes behind the incarnation of God the Son. May these words encourage you, as they encourage me: **"Because God's children are human beings – made of flesh and blood – the Son also became flesh and blood. For only as a human being could He die, and only by dying could He break the power of the devil, who had the power of death. Only in this way could He set free all who have lived their lives as slaves to the fear of dying..."**

"Therefore, it was necessary for Him to be made in every respect like us, His brothers and sisters, so that He could be our merciful and faithful High Priest before God. Then He could offer a sacrifice that would take away the sins of the people. Since He Himself has gone through suffering and testing, He is able to help us when we are being tested"

(Hebrews 2:14-15, 17-18 NLT).
